

ReelOut takes place on the unceded traditional territories of the Mohawk, Anishinabek, Huron-Wendat, Algonquin, Iroquois, Mississauga and, later, the Metis settlers. February is Black History Month.

This year we mark our silver anniversary celebrating 25 fabulous years of independent queer cinema

We're showcasing over 90 films from 35 countries/diasporas and we'll be revisiting some of our most beloved themes from past years including our Reel Peeps Doc Series, our RealOut Doc Series, our ReelOut in the Dark "Thriller" spotlight and of course our exciting narratives and incredible shorts programs as well. We're also thrilled to be showcasing retrospective works from the early 90s by Midi Onodera (Skin Deep) and the Kingston-lensed Dreamers of the Day by Patricia Rivera Spencer!

One of the unique trends our programming committee noticed when considering the hundreds of submissions since May of 2023, was the sheer number of films that incorporated song and dance; including films that wouldn't be considered part of the musical genre (the Acadian feature-doc Y a une étoile (There's a Star) for example); our opening (Peafowl) and closing (Glitter and Doom) selections revolve around dance as an expression of queerness; we witness the rise of the musical genius of Witch Prophet (Leilani's Fortune); the steamy erotic dance film Aligned; and an entire shorts program filled with memorable musical moments (Happy Feet & Melodies Sweet). Perhaps having been sequestered away from each other for many years, and now living in a world at war, creatives were ready to explode in the most sincere forms of artistic expression.

We hope that for 10 days, we can offer a slice of sanity and positivity to anyone and everyone that wishes peace on this earth and a kinder and more empathetic society.





By doing that, she wants to change people's perception of beauty and queerness and bring attention to the harassment of the LGBTQ+ community. The performances—often dark, strange, evocative, and queer at their core—are a manifestation of Gena's subconscious. But they come at a price.

SHORTS PROGRAM AND PERFORMANCES

Sorry I'm late I didn't want to come, shorts program and performances presented by Wee Bit Off Centre, an embryonic art centre and a gathering place for its own imagining. SILIDWTC indulges a fascination with failure, something that queer folks have always done deftly and with elan. It brings scenes of refusal and futility and redundancy across several short videos together with live performances of rejections that have been reworked at our upcoming public workshop.

This program is being presented as part of Wee Bit Off Centre's rethinking of art institutional practices, including how failure helps us articulate visions of working and being together unavailable under current logics of success.

Initiated by Tear Jerkers (Michelle Bunton and GHY Cheung), WBOC is co-stewarded alongside William Carroll, Em Harmsen, Faten Nastas Mitwasi and Mehvish Rather. The project is curated by Nasrin Himada, Associate Curator, Academic Outreach and Community Engagement, at Agnes Etherington Art Centre. WBOC takes up residence across Etherington House and other off-site locations from I January to 31 March 2024.

Muhsin Hendricks was a fashion designer in South Africa, who struggled to reconcile his sexuality with his faith. He studied in Pakistan to become an imam—a religious leader—so that he could understand Islam more deeply. After deciding that he had to be truthful to himself and the world, he came out in 1995, and established the radically-inclusive mosque in Cape Town that gave rise to the global queer Muslim network. Today, Hendricks leads a devoted group of LGBTQ+ Muslims and allies, based in a working-class neighborhood of the city. He decides to take his work to where it is needed most: the East African communities living under anti-LGBTQ+ laws.



A young non-binary person feels overwhelmed and wants to escape – literally, to the moon.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

d. Stan Oversteegen/The Netherlands/2023/4:48

In this short animated documentary, young queer people share their experiences on what it's like to deviate from the straight-, cis- norm and how this makes them feel.

THIS LIGHT IS MY BIRTHPLACE

d. Shaun Soutar/Canada/2023/14:28/

Two opposing TV signals compete for airtime. The usual narratives of trans identity touted by dominant media are disrupted by authentic stories from trans people.

VEGAS

d. Anna Wheeler/Canada/2023/10:30

A disillusioned artist-turned taxi driver picks up an unassuming stranger and things take a dramatic turn when it is revealed not everything is as it appears. Vegas is a coming of age dramedy, wrapped inside a neon-noir urban mystery.

RIVER

d. Rafal Sokolowski & Kanat Umurbekov/USA/2023/9:00

River, a trans woman, returns home to attend the funeral of her estranged father. She arrives consumed by regret for not seeing him before he passed, but instead of closure, she finds that the funeral has been staged and that her father faked his death to lure her into 'conversion therapy'.

d. Katie McNeice/Ireland/2023/18:00

A young dad in rural Ireland must face his anxiety around gender and bullying when his baby is born Intersex.



ABAN

d. Abbas Taheri & Mahdieh Toosi/Iran/2023/15:59

Under constant pressure from her exhusband, Nazanin should turn their child – Aban, nine years old – away from a very driven feminine taste. One day, Aban goes to the hospital thinking of undergoing life-changing surgery.

MICKEY

d. Stevey Hunter/Canada/2023/5:19

Mickey isn't one to share their feelings. But after a winter-break fling, everything changes. Will they work up the courage to express how they really feel?

GORDITX

d. Malik Ever/USA/2023/14:55







As the colonial chronicles of the 15th and 17th centuries collect, several indigenous peoples of America considered that gender was not binary, male and female, on the contrary, diversity was the rule. In Panama, the Guna People identify Omeggid people as a third gender, which implies much more than a sexual orientation or erotic preference.

Guna society is matrilineal, the figure of women is very important in this society, they are the ones who inherit the lands, and although they do not exercise leadership positions in the general congress, they are highly respected and venerated. This is why when a child is approached by women's tasks and behaviours in that sense, mothers raise them as if they were women.

Nandin, Yineth, Rosario and Débora are some of the members of the Wigudun Galu Group (the house of Wigudun, a movement that brings together the Omeggids protagonists of this film).

This film brings together 4 protagonists in their intimacy, such as mothers, couples, professionals and leaders of the Wigudun movement. They define themselves as a separate group and their claims are particular to their group. They want visibility, their struggle is uphill, they are Indigenous, they are Trans, they are Ommegids. Discriminated inside and outside their community.
